#### **Institutional History**

Established in 1848, The State Reform School for Boys was the first of its kind in the United States. The Massachusetts State Legislature selected Westborough for this new experiment—which sought to reform and educate juvenile offenders as opposed to punishing them—due to its central location and agricultural setting. The reform school originally housed 300 boys along the banks of Lake Chauncy and in 1852 an addition was added to accommodate 300 more. The goal of the school was to train the boys in trade professions so that they could pursue meaningful employment upon leaving.

In 1880, the Massachusetts Legislature concluded that the congregate style of housing boys was a failure. It decided to repurpose the property and establish the Westborough Insane Hospital, and it moved the reform school to another location in Westborough a couple miles away along what is now Oak Street. The school was renamed The Lyman School for Boys in 1884, and it instituted a "cottage system" where groups of boys lived together under smaller, separate roofs in order to create a more "family" type setting.

The Lyman School operated until 1971, when it was closed down by the state.

## **Scope and Content Note**

The Robert Cleaves Collection of Lyman School Records provides great insight into the early years of the State Reform School for Boys and the Lyman School. Most notably, the collection includes meeting minutes of the school's Board of Trustees beginning with its very first meeting in 1847 up until 1860. The rest of the collection focuses on operations of the school in the early twentieth century and includes annual reports and school and student publications printed by the boys as part of their training. The collection of photographs show the boys engaged in a number of activities and roughly date between 1905 and 1912.
